## FUNDING OUR SX SCHOLARSHIPS

Now that the 160th anniversary is behind us, we look forward to guiding the chapter to its 165th. Recently, the House Corp ran a successful campaign to raise scholarship funds for qualifying undergraduates. Our alumni contributed just under \$3,000 in a little over a month. Thanks to the generosity of our brothers, we can sustain the Gerry Royals '54 and Jeff Gier '22 scholarships for an additional 2-4 years.
