Battlefield Sig! In this edition, we celebrate the achievements of our youngest brothers over the past few months while looking to upcoming developments in our alumni brothers' lives and the state of Greek life at Gettysburg.

This February, the Gettysburg Office of Student Activities and Greek Life indicated the College's renewed interest in promoting its fraternities and sororities. The College is looking to put Greek organizations front and center as valued communities on campus. These ambitions bring good news for Theta, for the College is willing to partner with us to improve and invest in our chapter house, proudly display the Sigma Chi crest around campus, and highlight the chapter's contributions to the Gettysburg community.

So far, the College is true to its word, allowing their first effort to materialize as a two-year trial period where freshmen can go through recruitment during their spring semester beginning spring 2026. Notably, this decision reverses college policy dating back to 1999, and the House Corp sees this as a viable opportunity to expand our brotherhood. We're taking steps now to address the challenges of taking an earlier class of brothers.

Considering these possibilities, the House Corp is preparing for future

investment in Theta: bolstering scholarship and securing financial sustainability. After a highly successful scholarship fundraising campaign outperforming goals last fall, the House Corp consulted with an alumnus on safe investment strategies. Through sound investment, we aim to grow our general and scholarship funds to meet the financial needs of the chapter long-term.

This semester's Jeff Gier Memorial Scholarship recipient is **Parker Cohen '26. Jeff Grier '23**, who passed away unexpectedly during his time at Gettysburg, was an advocate for the benefits of studying abroad. His scholarship helps brothers fund their semesters around the globe. Parker has put his scholarship to good use by studying in Aix-en-Provence, France.

Lastly, we turn our attention to our alumni's recent engagements. Love has been in the air, it seems, so we celebrate our brothers who have taken on new commitments toward marriage. The House Corp thanks you all for sharing these moments with us!

He has many wonderful memories of his time in Theta Chapter. "As a freshman, I remember having to entertain the brothers at lunch with skits—some of the funniest memories from college."

When Greg's sons chose to join Sigma Chi, he hoped they would have a similar experience to what he had and that they would make lifelong friends.

When it was time for **Drew '18** to decide which fraternity to join, "I found a group of men in Sigma Chi who were academically driven, kind, inclusive, and fun-loving." Sigma Chi allowed him to work toward a common goal with likeminded people from different backgrounds.

am proud to announce that Theta Chapter has continued to be an impactful force on campus. Over the last few months, we successfully initiated a spring pledge class and actively participated in several philanthropic events, including Pie-a-Pi, Pie-a-Chi, Chi-O Night Live, and Mr. AOII. Moreover, seniors Michael Fellmann '25 and Jude Belas '25 presented their capstone projects, contributing to the advancement of academic research.

Regarding the spring pledge class, the chapter welcomed two initiates, Lorenzo Zullo '26 and Nate Hoang '26, who have since lent their efforts to the chapter's signature philanthropic initiative: Derby Days. This annual fundraising event supports the Huntsman Cancer Research Institute, in partnership with Sigma Chi

chapters across the continent, with our past efforts raising between \$25,000 to \$50,000 through a week-long series of activities engaging with sororities. Theta Chapter has raised over \$24,000 so far!

In addition to our regular campus involvement and annual philanthropy, Theta Chapter had the honor of hosting this year's Province Workshop. 
